Roads to Recovery projects progressing

Three Roads to **Recovery projects** are underway in the Shire. The projects are at: •Teryawynia-Ashmont Road Menindee-Ivanhoe Road Menindee-Wilcannia East Road. Work involves new reinforced concrete box culverts installations and will improve road safety

and reduce the impacts of flooding in times of high Darling River Flows. The total project cost is \$1.2 million. Work at Teryawynia-Ashmont Road is nearing completion with guardrail and road works remaining. The Menindee-Ivanhoe Road and Menindee-Wilcannia East Road are about 25% complete.

The Wilcannia and Ivanhoe Post Offices will remain open as usual. At the November Council Meeting an update on the Wilcannia Weir was provided. The Independent Review Panel visited Wilcannia on 10 November, Panel members

viewed the proposed location for the new weir, and also visited



numerous sites of interest. They also met with key stakeholder groups and members of the community. The panel is expected to report back to the Minister either the first or second quarter of 2025.

Stories behind the Stones almost ready

The Stories behind the Stones app modules are getting closer to release. Created by Dr Bernadette Drabsch and Ben Churcher, and funded through a Heritage NSW Community Heritage Grant, the modules will be part of the Central Darling Heritage Trail App. The focus is on local cemeteries. Many interesting stories about the people who lived and died in the region will be included in the app. The Menindee, Wilcannia and Ivanhoe modules are completed. The White Cliffs module is on its way. The team will return to the Shire early next year for field testing.
