Updating progress on Water Treatment Plants

The White Cliffs Water
Treatment Plant is 85 per cent
complete. SNG Engineering
started works in March and it
is expected to be finished in
November 2024.

The White Cliffs Reticulation works are progressing well. Approximately 90 per cent of the town reticulation upgrade length has been completed.

The Ivanhoe Water Treatment Plant Tender was awarded to Liquitek Pty Ltd after the May Council meeting. Initial design reviews are in progress.

The Wilcannia Water
Treatment Plant has not been

awarded. Further process designs are being reviewed by the Department of Health to ensure the new plant will be capable of treating possible contaminated raw water supply from the proposed new weir pool.

It is anticipated to call tenders for the Wilcannia plant prior to December 2024.

The water treatment plants would not be possible without funding from the Commonwealth government, Restart NSW and the Safe and Secure Water program.



The White Cliffs Water Treatment Plant is expected to be completed in November. Work started in March this year. The Reticulation works at White Cliffs are also progressing well and almost finished.

Flood planning for the future - have your say

Central Darling Shire Council has engaged consultants to undertake the Central Darling Shire Flood Risk Management Study and Plan which will focus on the townships of Wilcannia, Menindee, Ivanhoe, Tilpa and Sunset Strip.

An important step in the preparation of this study and plan is the gathering of information on historic flood behaviour and an appraisal of what flood related issues are important to the community. A questionnaire is available for residents and businesses to assist the consultant in gathering this important information. The questionnaire is also available from Council offices and Council's website.



People have until Friday 29 November 2024 to provide information to the Central Darling Shire Flood Risk Management Study and Plan.

Wilcannia weir review panel announced

The NSW Minister for Water, Rose Jackson has appointed the Independent Review Panel for the Wilcannia Weir Replacement Project. It follows the Minister's visit to Wilcannia in June. Panel members were chosen following recommendations received from the community. The panel will look into the environmental impacts, safety and operational concerns that to led the Department changing the design for a new weir following the public exhibition of the project's Environmental



will consider the rationale for changing the weir's height and other community concerns. The Review Panel members are: • Geoff Wise – Chairman of the Western Lands Advisory Council.

Water health focus

The Department of Climate Change, Energy, the **Environment and** Water is continuing its extensive data collection on the water quality and ecological health of the Darling-Baaka River and the Great Darling Anabranch on behalf of the Environment Protection Authority. This data is crucial for understanding the impacts of environmental



changes in the region, and developing strategies to protect the river. Keep an eye out for interim results for the broader monitoring program later this year. Water quality results are available on the NSW EPA website.
